This article explains what Learning Paths are in Big Think+ and how to use them to build a focused set of leadership or business skills over time.

A **Learning Path** is an organized series of [Video Lessons](#) that guide you through a topic. Each Learning Path is built around a key leadership or business capability — like communication, hiring, or innovation — and brings together insights from multiple experts to help you build mastery over time.

What will I see on a Learning Path page?

Each Learning Path includes:

- A **title** that provides a brief introduction to the topic
- A list of **Learning Objectives** to set your focus
- A lineup of **expert-led video lessons** from multiple speakers
 - Each *video lesson tile* shows the **title**, **expert**, **duration**, and **completion progress**
- Options to **add the learning path to a curation** or **share a direct link** to the full path

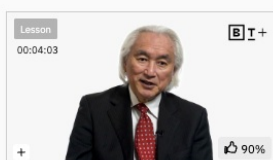

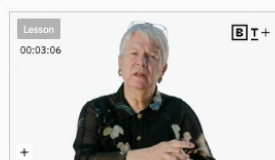

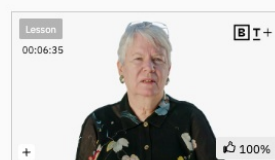
